We are currently recruiting for Mrs Woolley's post and will let parents know when we have news to share about this.

Communication with us:

We appreciate parents keeping in touch with us. Sometimes you need to let us know of concerns, or things that have happened at home.

We currently have these methods available:

General enquiries - contact the school office. Either in person, phone or email ADD

On the door in the morning – pass a message to a member of staff on the door

We are adding another method for pastoral needs. These are specifically for you to share concerns or things we need to know about your child from a pastoral perspective. These messages are checked by the phase leaders (Miss Mccunnin – Year 5/6, Mrs Lewis – Years 2,3,4, Mrs Barker – Years R and 1) and will passed to the most appropriate person to respond to. Messages will not get an instant reply, we will get back to you as soon as we can. For anything urgent, the quickest method is a phone call to the school office.

Coronavirus update:

We are continuing to follow the advice given to us by the Department for Education and Public Health England.

As public events have not been suspended, we are not currently cancelling school events or visits. However, we will keep the situation under review and adapt as per the advice we are given.

We have put initial plans in place to provide children with learning at home should schools be closed; we expect this method to be via Bromcom. Therefore, if you are having any difficulty accessing Bromcom please let school know on Monday so we can rectify this. If this happens, we will obviously share all that information with you. We have also put a plan in place should we have significant staff absence, but the school remains open.

It is now clear that the handwashing procedures the DFE asked schools to put in place during the half-term break are going to be long term measures. We are no longer able to get hold of 60%+ alcohol hand sanitiser. Therefore, we are going to need to change our handwashing procedure. This will be more disruptive, as we must manage large numbers of children through toilets many times a day, however it is important that we follow these measures.

From Monday, children will be washing their hands in running water with soap. We have good stocks of soap and paper towels in preparation for this.

I know some children need to use a moisturiser at the moment. If this needs to continue please bring it to the school office.

Stay at home if you have coronavirus symptoms

Stay at home for 7 days if you have either:

- a high temperature
- a new continuous cough

Do not go to a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital.

You do not need to contact 111 to tell them you're staying at home.

Read our advice about staying at home.

Use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service if:

- you feel you cannot cope with your symptoms at home
- your condition gets worse
- your symptoms do not get better after 7 days

If this applies to your child, please phone the school office to let us know.

We have had some queries about what happens if there is a confirmed case of coronavirus in the school population. As of this morning, there were no confirmed cases in Telford and Wrekin. If there were a case in the school population, Public Health England look at the individual circumstances and tell us what we need to do – we, of course, will follow what they tell us.
