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## UPDATES

### **Procedures for the start and end of the day:**

As we have said in previous emails, there are new start and end of day procedures. Year 5 children have all had a letter explaining how they can go home along in Year 6.

### Start of day:

Children need to line up, outside their wing in their designated class spot. On the first day, teachers will be in these spots to show children where to go. Children will also be using these spots at the end of break and lunchtime, so they will become used to them.

A member of staff, will be stood at the door from 8:50 – 9:00 and will take any messages for teachers. Teachers will be in class, so that children can begin learning as soon as they go into class, from 8:50am.

At 9:00am, the doors will be closed and locked. Any children arriving after this time will need to go to reception to sign in late.

### End of day:


At the end of the day, teachers will bring children to their designated class spot, outside their doors at the end of the day and dismiss them from this spot. The exception is Reception classes, who will continue to be dismissed from the Reception Unit doors.

Year 6 pupils, who permission to leave on their own, will be allowed to go at the end of the day. Those who do not, will be passed to parents from their class spot.
