UPDATES AND INFORMATION

Coronavirus:

You will no doubt have seen the press reports that Telford and Wrekin expect to enter tier 2 restrictions soon. The information statistics were released last night that shows a quadrupling of cases in Telford and Wrekin over the last 4 weeks. Due to the local increase in the virus, from Monday, we are asking all adults to wear masks at the main drop off and pick up times (except if you cannot wear a mask for medical reasons). For drop off and pick up from wrap around care, you don't need to wear a mask, because there are so few people on site at this time and it's very easy to social distance.

Please also see our letter yesterday about handwashing and distancing.

In summary:

From Monday, adults need to wear a face mask for drop off and collection of pupils.

Work for children absent from school:

We have a number of children who need to self-isolate at the moment linked to coronavirus. Work that isolating children need to complete is added to MCAS each week and there is learning there for each day. Work can be photographed and sent into teachers via the school email address.

Email addresses:

We have had a few emails sent to the Google account that we run our surveys and Google forms from. This isn't a monitored email address – we only use it for the form collections we do. If you need to email school, please use the stpetersbratton@taw.org.uk email. Thank you.

Smoking:

We've had some complaints about people smoking in the queue to enter the school site. Can we ask you not to smoke in or around the school site please.

Ventilation:

Part of our risk assessment for coronavirus is to ensure good ventilation in schools. As the weather has got colder, the heating has gone on and remains on until 6pm each day. However, windows are open and will need to remain open whilst the building is occupied (unless the guidance changes).

I know some children really don't feel the cold, but others do and might find this helpful. Children can wear these in class if they want. If you do buy one, please do make sure it is named!
