UPDATES AND INFORMATION

Covid Symptom Study App:

On Wednesday we wrote to you to tell you we have signed the school up for the covid symptom study app – also known as the ZOE app. This works in the same way as the version for adults, but will give researchers and school information about children's health and viral transfer. There has been information in the media about how children may carry the covid infection without displaying classic symptoms.

To get meaningful information from this, 30% or more of the school population needs to signed up. At the time of writing, about 10% have signed up. Therefore, please download the Zoe app and sign up to give reports on your children. Our school specific code is BDMTUUB. There was an issue on Wednesday afternoon where 6O2 were not showing, this should now be fixed but please let us know if you discover 6O2 is missing.

Learning conference:

Lots of teachers are involved in Learning Conferences over the next 2 weeks, many starting at 3.30pm. Therefore, teachers might not have the capacity to talk to you at the end of the day. Just as a reminder, children are available to collect from 3.10pm when the gates open and we expect all children to be collected by 3.20pm.

Thank you to those of you who have given us the phone number to use for your learning conference telephone appointments. For those of you who haven't, teachers will need to spend the first part of your allocated time trying the different phone numbers we hold for each child until we reach the right person. You can make sure we get straight through to the right person by giving us the number to call. You can do this <u>here</u>.

As a reminder for parents, phone calls may come from the main school number, a number you don't recognise (which is another internal school number) or a withheld/ unknown number.

Christmas Lunch

Wednesday 9th December

Christmas lunch is happening in bubbles, in the classrooms this year. There is a separate letter with details and the link to place your orders. An order needs to be placed for all children who want a meal on this day by 1st December.

The day will give children the chance to take part in some festive activities, learn about the charity we are supporting and hopefully raise money in the process.

Flu Vaccines


