Dear Parents,

I hope you and the children enjoyed the half-term break and that you got some rest and relaxation as well. Personally, the Scottish Highlands for the week did me the power of good!

I have got various updates for you below...

COVID Update:

You are probably aware through communications from the Local Authority that local cases of covid have continued to climb due to the growth of national cases. The communication last night identities this as the start of the third wave. You can find the briefing here.

With this in mind, it is really important that we follow the restrictions that we have in place. Almost everyone is doing a great job of wearing face masks, following the one-way systems and washing hands. Please do keep it up and we do need children to wash their hands before going into school.

As per covid restrictions, we still need to keep children in small consistent bubbles (I.e. just their class) and not allow children to mix beyond this, as we have been doing for what seems like forever now. As it stands, although we would love to, we will not be able to have events like sports days happen this summer. Should the guidance and case levels change, we will of course review this – but for now, that is the situation. What we will do is get children to complete events in their bubbles and tweet and communicate pictures and information with you.

End of term:

We've had a few questions this week about class moves, reports, and holiday clubs.

Class moves and new class days:

Last year we needed to organise classes based on the need for wrap around care. We do not need to do this for September and wrap around has been available for all children where needed for the last half-term. In some year groups, we will be doing a significant class re-organisation and in others we will do very little. In those year groups where we are making some changes, teachers will be asking children to name a good learning friend who they would like to be in class with. We can't guarantee that this will be the case, but it will inform what we do. Existing class teachers organise pupils into classes, as they know them best and the school leadership team then check them. Sometimes though, parents tell us about something serious that will impact on class moves after children have met in their new classes. This is then difficult to

manage. Therefore, if there is something you need to share with us that might impact on classes, please can you email the school office for my attention by next Friday - 18th June.

Due to the covid restrictions of bubbles, we are not going to be able to run new class days this year, as we usually do. Children will get the opportunity to meet their new teacher for next year, but that will be all.

Reports:

School reports are being written this summer and are due out week beginning 5th July.

Holiday club:

We are putting together our holiday club plans at the moment for the summer holidays. We are likely to be closed the final two weeks of the summer $(23^{rd} \text{ August} - 3^{rd} \text{ September})$. What we offer will be provisional and may change based on what is happening with infection levels, but we will release details of this next Friday for you.

As always, questions, problems, concerns or just to say hello you will find myself and Mrs Oakley on the playground most mornings and afternoons.
