Prior learning

Key Aspects covered

Pupils will know:

- How belonging to Christianity or Islam is expressed through resisting temptation
- The impacts of religion and moral teaching in our choices.
- How to make links between their own values and experience and the stories, rituals and commitment of Muslims and Christians.
- Make links between Muslim and Christian beliefs and values about temptation.
- Understand the idea of forgiveness and make their own links between religious teachings, saying sorry and being forgiven.
- There are consequences to those that give into temptation.

Knowledge expectations

- Describe somethings Muslims or Christians think are wrong and some things they think are very good.
- Use a widening religious vocabulary to show that they understand what Christians think about temptations.
- Use a widening religious vocabulary to show that they understand what Muslims think about temptation.
- Retell the story of Jesus' temptation or another story of temptation.
- Raise and begin to answer questions about temptations of their own.
