Unit name: 2b.6 Salvation: what difference
does the resurrection make for Christians?

Big Ideas

Christians believe the Jesus was resurrected and was seen by many witnesses three days after his death.

Explain why some people find the belief in the Resurrection makes sense and inspires them.

Prior learning

Christians remember Jesus' sacrifice through the service of Holy Communion.

Jesus is a saviour to Christians as he saves them from sin and leads them from temptation back to God.

Key Aspects covered

In this unit pupils will know:

- The timeline of the 'big story' of the Bible explaining the place of the Easter Story.
- To use theological terms when explaining connections between Luke 24 and the Christian concepts.
- Belief in Jesus' resurrection confirms to Christians that Jesus is the incarnate Son of God, but also that death is not the end.
- This belief gives Christians hope for life with God, starting now and continuing in a new life (heaven).
- The changes of emotions Christians feel between Good Friday and Easter Monday
- To reflect on how Christians feel on Easter Sunday through songs and hymns and why this is different to Good Friday.

Knowledge expectations

- Suggest meanings for resurrection accounts and compare their ideas in which Christians interpret these texts.
- Explain connections between Luke 24 and the Christians concepts of sacrifice, resurrection, salvation, incarnation, and hope.
- Make clear connections between Christian belief in the Resurrection and how Christian's worship on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
- Jesus 'saved' people by defeating death by resurrecting three days after dying on the cross.
