Big Ideas

What big and puzzling questions do we like?

What answers do religions give to some of these questions?

What can we say about big puzzles and mysteries?

Spiritual Development

Beginning to learn simply about and reflecting on important concepts and beliefs that are at the heart of religious traditions, and by sharing amazement and wonder.

Prior learning

Aware of different religion learnt in EYFS and their different beliefs.

Understand that there are many religions and that we can answer a mystery or a puzzle with a belief.

Key Aspects covered.

In this unit of RE work children will learn:

- Stories can make us think about puzzling questions.
- Sikh Story: The Milk and the Jasmine Flower. What do Sikhs think about Guru Nanak?
- Christian Story: Jesus heals the 10 lepers: Why Jesus helped everyone and what Christians thought about him.
- Some questions are puzzling or interesting even when we don't know the answer.
- About mysteries
- questions they would like to ask (their) God/ the person who knows everything.

Knowledge expectations

To know:

- A name of a story or book that they like that has a mystery in it.
- A book that a Christian think answers a mystery question (The Bible) and that of one other religion (Sikhs)

<u>Can:</u>

- Talk about a puzzling question, for example: where do we come from?
- Talk about what Christians or Sikhs say about God.
- Experience a sense of wonder about stories, nature and questions.
