Walking home in Year 6:


We have made a change to our policy for September of Year 6 children walking home on their own. For September, it will say:

In Year 6 in preparation for secondary school we try to encourage independence when walking home. We allow children to leave school and walk home alone when parents have given us written permission. However, this privilege can be withdrawn. The letters to parents to allow this will be sent no earlier than the start of the second half-term in Autumn. Teachers will decide when to send the letter on an individual basis once they know the children.



Year 3 have had a busy week... they have been writing persuasive letters in English. They have fantastic persuasion skills!

In maths, we have been looking at shapes and angles. This week, we have been making and recognising 3D shapes. The children enjoyed experimenting with multilink to see how many different cuboids they could make with a given number of cubes.



We have also enjoyed our termly visit to our Squirrel School area! Their den building skills are improving each time; they're creating some fantastic and creative dens using the tarpaulins and rope. If you ever fancy a snack too- they're cooking up some delicious snacks in the mud kitchens! I'm sure they'll happily share their recipes with you!



We are so proud of all of our achievements this year! In PSHE, we have spent some time reflecting on this during the week. As we prepare for the next stage of our journey, we have stopped to consider all of the

<u>Art</u>

In art, we have been studying mark making and focusing on natural forms. We began by making some detailed sketches of birds nests, working on creating the desires shape and textures, We then had a fantastic afternoon working outside, where we developed our sketches further by working over the using a range of different materials. We chose between watercolour, oil pastels, charcoal and chalk to create our chosen effects. We were really pleased with the results!



They focused on shape and finding ways to bind the materials together just like birds do. We have finished our unit this week with our own reports about our own civilisations. The children had great fun using their imaginations to create their own society, crops, language and way of life. 


History


