Knowledge/Skills:		
Listen and Appraise:	Identify the piece's structure: Introduction, verse, chorus. Identify the instruments/voices: Male/female voices, bass, drums, guitar, keyboard, synthesizer. Find the pulse while listening.

Big Ideas:
