### Prior learning

# Key Aspects covered

- God makes covenants with his people which show people correct beliefs, attitudes and behaviours that are appropriate for being in a relationship with God.
- For Christians, Abraham is a hero of faith. He trusts in and obeys God.
- Christians like The Salvation Army today help to shape their lives to follow God and be a People of God.

# Big Ideas

Christians believe that God's actions (through stories in the Bible) show people how to live and have a close relationship with God.

There is promise and covenant between God and people.

Covenant show people correct beliefs, attitudes and behaviours for a relationship with God.
