Prior learning

The Easter story - that Jesus died on a cross and came back to life on Easter Sunday.

Jesus was born at Christmas time.

A palm cross is a special symbol.

Key Aspects covered

In this unit of RE work children will know:

- Pupils will reflect on the way the story changes from sadness to happiness or from darkness to light.
- Tell stories of Holy Week and Easter from the Bible.
- How Christians celebrate Holy Week- traditions, church service, food.
- the Easter story through a sensory experience.
- That Easter eggs a symbol of new life.

Knowledge expectations

• Pupils will know that Easter is a very important in the 'big story' of the bible.
