Lunchtimes



We know that all children benefit from breaks away from the classroom at playtime and lunchtime, however for some pupils the business of the dinner hall can be quite daunting or distressing. Having collated all the pupil questionnaires two areas were highlighted, playground and the dinner hall. In order to address this after half term we will be starting family service. Instead of queuing for lunch pupils will have a dedicated time slot with a designated seat they will sit in each day. We will be promoting social skills through conversations at the dining table and older children will help to support younger children with their ability to use a knife and fork.

These time slots will also reduce the number of pupils on the playground and help the staff interact with the pupils in games and activities.

Paying For Lunches

First Aid

Head bumps- currently

- > If your child has a head bump they are assessed by a member of staff who is first aid trained.
- > A first aid slip is completed which is sent home.
- A text message is sent to parents.
- > If the incident happens at lunchtime, the lunchtime supervisors let the class teacher know.

After half term- in addition

- Your child will have a black wrist band following a head bump. This advises everyone that has contact with your child to be observant.
- > Please make sure you remove the wristband before they come to school the next day.

First Aid White Slips

In school, most of our support staff are trained in paediatric first aid. This is updated regularly. You will only receive a white slip if your child has needed first aid treatment in school. Children often fall over and need no treatment.


