It will be delivered in two services. EYFS and KS1 (years Reception,1 and 2) together 9:30-10:30am and KS2 (years 3-6) service 11-12.


It will be a time of celebration, singing, speaking and bible readings.

We will also be looking at Mary Seacole and a local nurse from Shrophsire; Agnes Hunt.




In PE we have enjoyed developing our skipping skills, using coordination, resilience, and perseverance.


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
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Did you know that it took over 200 years for historians to decipher hieroglyphs?
