In literacy this half term we have really enjoyed reading, 'The Tiny Seed,' by Eric Carle.









The children have had great fun learning all about seeds, plants and growing this term.

Reception have been finding out about what seeds need to grow well and how to care for plants.















Children have explored different activities including role playing in our garden centre, planting beans, writing phonetically decodable sentences, labelling flowers and sharing their experiences of being gardeners.















Last week we celebrated Science Week in school. We explored the question 'what can you do in 1 minute?'. Year 1 and year 6 paired up and they found out that year 6 children were slower at jumping than year 1s!



Yesterday, the children went to church to perform the story of 'The Three Little Trees' for their Easter Service. It was a lovely morning, and we were very proud of the children's acting and singing.

# Wrap Around May Holiday Club!
