#### Year 5

Our exciting and engaging return to school involves a focus on Vikings for our Year 5 pupils. We have pondered and predicted what Viking artefacts could have been used for, before finally learning the real purpose. It might surprise you to find out that one of the artefacts pictured was an anchor! The Year 5 pupils had great fun thinking like a historian and using their prior knowledge to help them.



#### Year 6

Last week children in Y6 had a great time visiting Cosford Air Museum. It was a great start to our WW2 History focus and the children came away with great enthusiasm and stories about what they had learned about the Blitz and the importance of air defence in WW2. Sitting in the aeroplane was certainly a highlight! Whilst there, we learnt all about staying safe in an air raid by entering an air raid shelter where we got to feel how claustrophobic and cold it was. We also looked at many artefacts including: a pilot's boot and learnt why the top came off; what a chamber was and why it was used; we looked at people's record books from the time and noted how little they had and how hard life would have been. We enjoyed looking at all the aircrafts but the thing that enthralled us the most was the people's real-life stories – the thing that amazed us was the pilot of an aircraft carrying his wedding cake topper to remind him of home. We would also like to say a huge thank you to the volunteers at Cosford who enabled us to enter an aircraft and find out how cramped the space was inside.
