





This week we have been writing exploring the style of the author and how he creates suspense and creates pictures in the reader's mind through his description.



Mrs. Lewis has been very pleased with the Maths group she has been working with this half term. This week we have been learning about decimal place value and addition and subtraction of decimals. She is really pleased with the way they are supporting each other in their learning.



In music we have been appraising the song 'I've got a Friend' by Carole King. We discussed our feelings when hearing it and what it made us think of. We then explored the tempo and dynamics of the piece. We were able to identify many of the instruments used. We are looking forward to playing out own instruments to accompany our singing.

On Monday, during our computing lesson, we had a visit from Mr Woods who works at the National Centre for Computing Education Programme.

He went through the basics of what a Micro:bit was, how we turned it on and connected it to our laptops.

We then went through a range of codes including logic, basic, maths and make a new variable to eventually make a rock, paper, scissors game. For example, we used code saying pick a number between 1 and 3. We then used code to say: if number is true to 1, show R. We are going to be applying the skills we have learnt to the rest of our work during this term.


