Phonics

ELS Phonics - Review Phase 3 sounds.

Introduce harder to read and spell words: when, what, so, have, were, out, like.

Expressive Arts & Design

Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings.

Children will choose to use a variety of media to create Easter cards.

Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing at the Easter service.

PSED

Build constructive and respectful relationships encouraging listening, sharing and cooperating with their peers.

Identify and moderate their feelings socially and emotionally.

Understand the importance of personal hygiene.

Physical Development

Develop overall body-strength, balance, co-ordination and agility. Refining a range of ball skills: throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting, and aiming.

Develop fine motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. Pencils for drawing and writing, paintbrushes, scissors, knives, forks and spoons.
