#### **UPDATES FROM THE CLASSES:**

#### **Arthog newsletter**

On Monday 16 September, 6W1 and 6W2 went to Arthog in Wales. We did lots of activities such as: Night time orienteering, gorge scrambling, kayaking, rock climbing, raft building, mountain walking and the night line etc.

Monday: A few of us were doing the Adam's Grammar and Newport Girls' tests whilst the rest of us were arriving at Arthog. We got ready for the week ahead of us. First of all we did orienteering after our lovely lunch. Then when the rest of us got back from the tests awaiting us was orienteering in the night. This included our torches and teamwork skills.

Tuesday: Some of us did different activities so this is the schedule for group 3. The first activity was gorge walking so we got ready by getting our waterproofs and wellies on. When we got in the gorge, our wellies filled up with water! We helped each other climb up the waterfalls. On our way to kayaking, we sang along to Radio 1. Once we got there, we were instructed on what to do. We got into our kayaks and started to paddle. For most of us, this was our favourite activity.

Wednesday: Today we did rock climbing by the beach. This was very difficult as we had to pull a rope to help the person on the rock climb up. After we finished this challenge we were allowed to search rock pools and swim in the sea. When we got back we were told that we were going to be doing raft building. To get ready we were taught how to tie a square knot. After we had got our raft in the water, we practised for the race against the other team. Eventually we got back to Arthog and did a night time photo search in partners.

Thursday: Today we woke up to get ready for the mountain walk all day. This was probably the most challenging activity we faced at Arthog. Climbing the 2<sup>nd</sup> biggest mountain (Cadair Idris) in Wales is tough. To end our day, we did a night line which is where you and your team hold onto a rope whilst guiding your friends through obstacles blind folded.

Friday: The last thing we did was plastic picking altogether on a nice, sandy beach. After we got ready for home, a tag with our school name on had been put on the board to show we had achieved the John Muir Award.

We were all sad when we had to leave Arthog but we were very glad to get home to our families. We had a brilliant time at Arthog and would like to thank our parents and teachers for letting us go!! Thank you!
