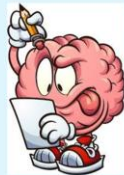

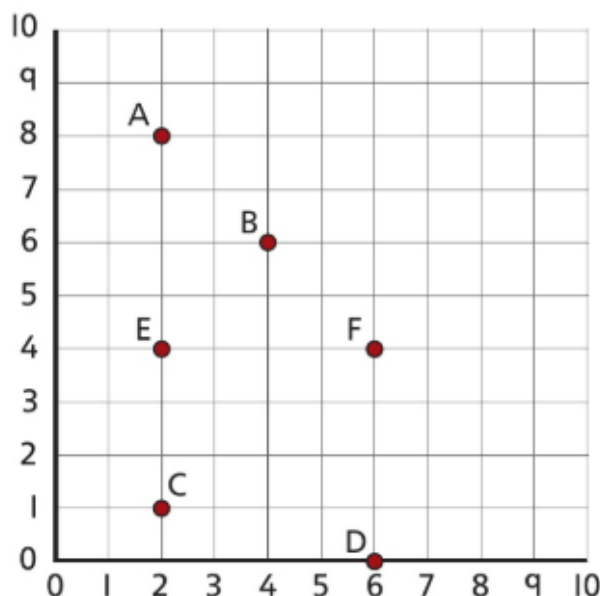
Maths

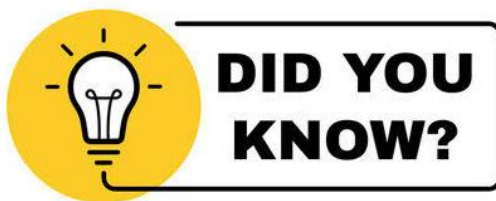


Summer Holiday Club!

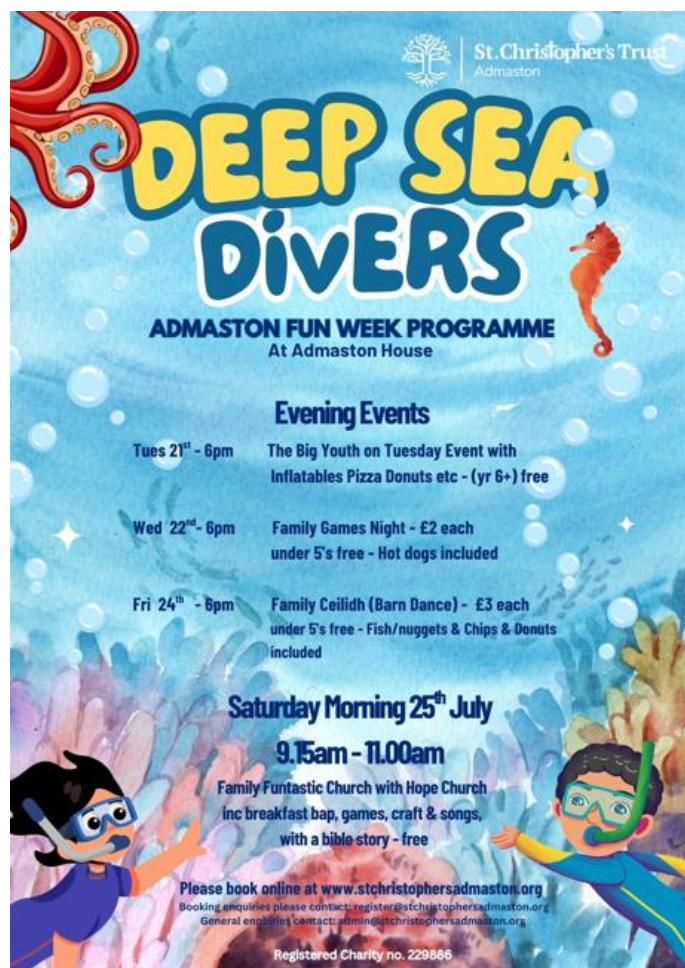
