Covid update

Our covid numbers have really come down in school now and we only have a few isolated cases at the time of writing. However, across the region and Telford in particular numbers have continued to rise.

It is helpful to us if you continue to let us know if your child tests positive for covid over the half term holiday. To do this please email <u>stpetersholidaycovid@gmail.com</u>

There is new regional advice out, which says:

If a member of the household tests positive, the child can continue to attend school (unless symptomatic) but the child should have a daily LFD test.

The advice remains the same if the child is symptomatic or generally unwell, which is to get a PCR test.

Therefore, parents might want to ensure you LFD tests available at home, if you do not have them already. There are new nasal only testing kits available, which are easier for children.

The page does say you need to be aged over 11 for these kits. We have checked this and are told that is the national advice and will remain on the website, but the regional advice should be followed.

Online Safety



We have attached some parental guides to help check settings of popular streaming sites (Disney+, Netflix and Prime) and we have some specific advice about Squid Game below. Please take time over half term to have a conversation with your child about what they are watching online on any internet enabled device. As with films, all TV programmes offered through these sites have age limits and offer overviews of the content shown. Some material from popular programmes aimed at an older audience is also accessible

through apps such as TikTok (13+). If you would like any help or support with any aspect of online safety, please contact your child's class teacher using the appropriate channels.

Squid Game

You may have heard of Squid Game, a programme on Netflix that has been very popular recently.

It's rated 15 due to its violent nature and sexual content. But there have been reports of younger children also watching it.

Children might also have seen parts of the programme recreated as challenges on social media, for example on TikTok, or they may have seen or played an online game that's based on it.

Recently, there have been some media reports of children recreating violent aspects of the show, though there haven't been reports of any children being seriously hurt.

What should parents do?

- It might be tempting to, but don't directly raise Squid Game with your child they might be unaware of it and mentioning it could make them more likely to seek it out.
- Do let your child know they can talk to you about anything they see online that they find upsetting. If you hear them talking about Squid Game or if they mention it to you, talk to them about how the show isn't meant for young children.

• We'd encourage you to take this opportunity to check your Netflix settings for your child's profile. You can set maturity ratings so that your child only sees TV shows and films that have a rating suitable for their age.

To do this:

From a web browser, go to your account page

Open the 'Profile and Parental Controls' settings for the profile you want to manage

Change the 'Viewing Restrictions' setting

Enter your Netflix password

Set the maturity rating level for the TV shows and films you want to allow in that profile

Select 'Save'

This half term we have been busy learning about China in geography, finding out about continuous line drawing and art and how to deal with their emotions in PSHE. In Year 2, we have been learning about how to add and subtract single digits using the column method. After half term, we will be moving on to adding and subtracting 2 digit numbers from 2 digit numbers. We would be very grateful if you could practise this skill over the half term break.

We have been looking at adding and subtracting by using regrouping.



The following YouTube videos will help explain the concepts and the process the children have learnt using Base 10 equipment and a place value chart. The children will be adding and subtracting within 100.
