Big Ideas
 Jesus died and was raised to life to bring in a new 'Kingdom' where God rules in people's lives.
 Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ.

Spiritual Development
 Reflect on how Pentecost is an important part of Christians lives and reminds them of Jesus' promise.

Prior learning
 Jesus came to Jerusalem to show what God had sent him to do.
 Pupils to reflect on how those in the Easter story and Christians today feel about Good Friday.

Hope
 I say this because I know what I have planned for you," says the Lord. "I have good plans for you. I don't plan to hurt you. I plan to give you hope and a good future.

Key Aspects covered
 In this unit of RE work children will learn:

- To link their learning of God as Trinity.
- Pentecost the church's birthday.
- To reflect on the emotions people may have felt on the day of Pentecost.
- The importance of the Holy Spirit.
- The power of the Holy Spirit.

Knowledge expectations
To know:

- How the disciples felt before Pentecost and after Pentecost.
- The emotions the disciples may felt.
- Christians believe that Jesus inaugurated the 'Kingdom of God' — i.e. Jesus' whole life was a demonstration of his belief that God is King, not just in heaven but here and now.
- What Pentecost means to some Christians now.
