Big Ideas

Key Aspects covered.

In this unit of RE work children will learn:

- Reflect on the Parable of the Two-House Builders and consider what makes for strong foundations in life.
- Discuss Where else do people get foundations for life (for example, in Islam, from the Five Pillars). How do these compare with Christian foundations.
- What good news does Jesus bring in 'A healing miracle: The Centurion's Servant, Luke 7:1-10.'

Knowledge expectations

To know:

- Connections between Gospel texts, Jesus' 'good news', and how Christians live in the Christian community and in their individual lives.
- An example of Christian mission healing.
- Christians see that Jesus' teachings and example cut across expectations, e.g., the Sermon on the Mount.

To explain:

- If Jesus as a healer has an impact on Christians today.
