

Summer Term 2024 Habitats







Reception have been learning all about animal habitats. Children have learnt about what animals eat, their shelter and where they bring their young up.

We have looked at animals from different climates from the desert to antarctica, to woodlands and the ocean.





The Life Cycle of a Frog

RO1 and RO2 have been learning all about the life cycle of frogs. They have looked at the dramatic changes of frogspawn with their jelly to grown adult frogs that live in water and on land.

Children created their own ponds with frogspawn and tadpoles using a mix of media including straws to blow and mix the paint to get a watery effect.









We have been exploring different types of feathers and drawing our own. We used our sketching pencils to draw them and then we added oil pastels to create detail. Year 1 thoroughly enjoyed creating their own feathers. We are really excited to finish our unit and create a free-standing bird. Well done Year 1 you tried really hard.

History







In History we have been learning about the importance of a shared alphabet for communication. We used a made-up alphabet to send messages. We enjoyed writing our own messages using the alphabet.
