Attendance Policy



As I reported in our first Newsletter, there has been a change in government policy for Attendance and Punctuality. In line with this we have produced a new Attendance Policy that we are very proud of. Our feedback from Telford and Wrekin was -

This is a fantastic policy – really well written, comprehensive and easily accessible to parents, and I love the narrow bandings on the explanation of what each % represents and how absence tots up over time. It's also great that you have made it very clear that your attendance aspirations for vulnerable pupils remain as high as for their peers.

We have sent out a copy of this policy and it is also available on the website. Any questions regarding this please contact the office.

Here are some of updated highlights:

End of the school day.

Only parents with parental responsibility can pick up pupils from school. Parents can provide written permission allowing another adult to pick up their child. The permission must include the details of the adult (18 or over) and when they will be picking up their child. If you are providing written permission via email, it must be from the email you have provided to school. Alternatively, a parent can tell the teaching assistant on the wing door in the morning. In an emergency, parents can telephone school, but this must be followed up with an email.

Penalty Notices

If issued with a first penalty notice for Term Time Leave or irregular attendance, the parent must pay £80 within 21 days, or £160 within 28 days.

If a second penalty notice for Term Time Leave or irregular attendance is issued to the same parent in respect of the same pupil, the parent must pay £160 if paid within 28 days.

A third penalty notice for Term Time Leave or irregular attendance cannot be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within 3 years of the date of the issue of the first penalty notice. In a case where the national threshold is met for a third time within those 3 years, alternative action will be taken instead. This could be prosecution at the Magistrates court.

10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

Penalty notice fines will be considered when there have been <u>less than</u> 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

Note: These sessions do not have to be consecutive.










Phonics Workshop

Reception

Science: Exploring Autumn















In their science lesson this week the children have explored the different seasons. Engaging in discussions and using visuals to compare them. They then embarked on an autumn walk to collect a variety of natural items, such as leaves sticks, conkers, and pinecones. During this exploration, the children talked about autumn, noting that, "The leaves change colours and start to fall off the trees." They also used their senses to describe the objects they found, expressing that some were, "Spiky like a hedgehog" and certain items, "Smelled like wood."



English

We have started our new unit Paddington at the Palace. We have enjoyed learning about the story, making predictions and sequencing the story.

<u>PE</u>

Our unit this half term is Dance. We are learning how to create our own dance using actions, pathways and counts. We have been practicing moving

to the count of 8 beats helping us stay in time with the music. We have linked our moves to different types of weather. The children have enjoyed discussing and sharing their ideas with partners.





Music

In Music we are enjoyed our unit Hey You which is a rap unit. The children have loved learning the words to the rap song. Yesterday we began to learn how to use instruments to develop the song. Well done Year one you are doing amazing ③



Science

In Science we have been learning all about materials. We have been looking at different everyday objects and identifying what material they are made from. Each group had different objects made from the same material, and we looked at their similarities and differences. The children enjoyed working as a group to identify them.
