

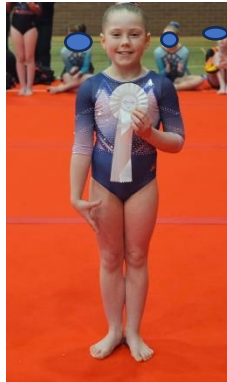
On Tuesday, Soda celebrated her ninth birthday (63 in dog years!!). Thank you for all the cards, treats and birthday strokes that she has received.

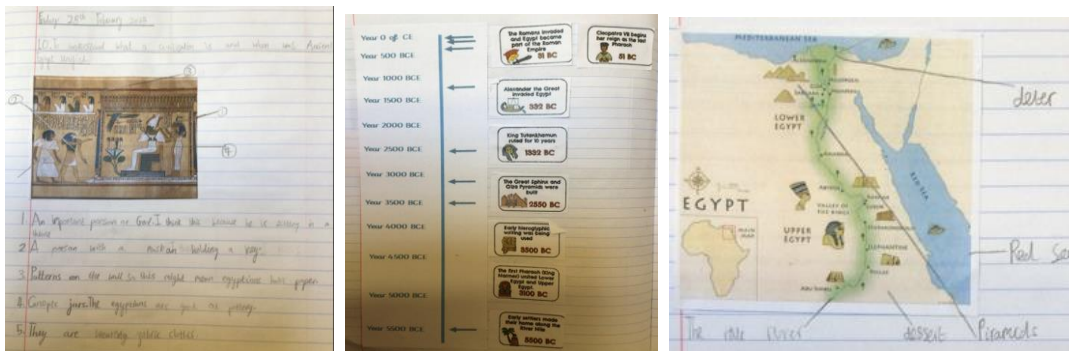
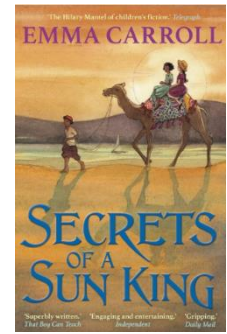

We have finished the week with a celebration of world book day. Thank you for all the amazing costumes and joining our parent reading sessions.



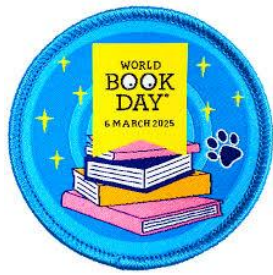


A fantastic trip to Wroxeter Roman City

Children across school had a lovely world book day. Many thanks to parents who were able to come in to read with the children at the beginning or end of the day; the children were really excited about this.

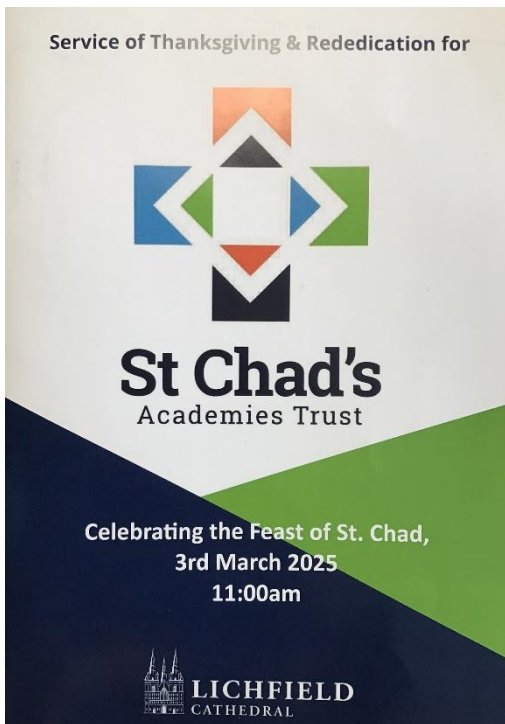

We had such a blessed time on Monday 3rd March at Lichfield. The service was led by the Canon Chancellor, Gregory Platten, a Director of St Chad's Academies Trust. Canon Gregory offered us an informal welcome, after which he invited us to stand to sing as the procession entered. We then sang: I the Lord of Sea and Sky.
