A Vision for St Peter's CE Bratton:

As part of our focus over the coming months, we are rewriting our vision. School has had aims over the years, but we are endeavouring to encompass what school stands for in a simple approach, that can be understood by the school community.

In writing our vision and values, we have considered all that a school stands for – learning, progress, our Christian basis, our work to nurture children and our support for their overall health and wellbeing.

We have been working on this now for some time. A group of staff and governors have met to explore this and we have also received some advice from our Christian Distinctiveness Adviser. We came up with some proposals that children and staff have fed back on. This established which set of values we were going to use. The full governing body have discussed the proposal and made a further refinement.

Having led this process before in schools, I can honestly say it doesn't get any easier! We've tried to be very inclusive in our approach and respect the different values of our school community.

Our draft vision, mission and values reads as:

Vision: Enriching lives every day

Mission: To enable our school community to learn, achieve and flourish through living 'life in all its fullness'

Values:

Excellence, Nurture, Respect, Integrity, Compassion, Hope

There are no plans to change our school logo or colours. But these values would be the half-termly themes for worship and would replace the 4Cs.

This is what is behind each of the aspects.

Vision: Enriching lives everyday. Through this we are outlining that we want everyone's lives to improve and to be better tomorrow than they are today. That is what we are striving towards. 'Enriching' encompasses this, but deliberately doesn't narrow to a particular area. Lives – we haven't narrowed this to who or in what way. Although our core purpose is learning, we do considerably more than this. There is a social element, a spiritual element as well as others and these applies to families and staff as well as the children we are here for.

Mission: Learn and achieve encompasses the learning and progress that we want children to make, each child achieving their potential. Life in all its fullness is a strapline from the Church of England, coming from John 10:10. This is outlined here <u>https://www.churchofengland.org/more/education-and-schools</u> along with further links. However, it is also something that is inclusive of those with Christian faith, non-Christian faith and of no faith.

Values: The values are the set of characteristics we want to embrace as a school. We deliberately have 6 so that there is one per half-term.

UPDATES FROM THE CLASSES:

The last few weeks Year 2 have been working hard at their Science lessons. We have been observing and describing how seeds grow into mature plants. WE have looked at some key questions: What does this bulb need to start growing? How could we care for this bulb? (Give it water, warmth, nutrients.) We often think that bulbs need soil, because in this country we usually see plants growing in soil. But plants can grow just in water, so long as the water has the right food in it to keep the plants healthy. We have been looking at **hydroponics** and what it means. Ask your children if they can tell you what it means. Growing plants in water. Can you imagine where it would be really useful to be able to grow plants without soil? Especially edible plants? (Cold places with no soil - Iceland, Antarctica -, hot places with no soil - Sahara, *Mars.) Year 2 have* up an organic hydroponics farm in the classroom.

What a GREAT way to learn our Science! Every morning they are excited to see the changes from a bean, shoot, roots, stem and now leaves. What excitement we have in class!
