



We enjoyed our Ancient Greece workshop with Shropshire Museums last week. Here are some photos of the day.





PSHE

This week in PSHE, we explored the important topic of safe relationships. The children had thoughtful discussions about what consent means in everyday life and why respecting boundaries is essential. It was fantastic to see how sensitive the children were about this topic, and we were able to have lots of mature conversations. To bring their ideas to life, they designed vibrant posters, poems or comic strips that promote positive messages about asking permission and respecting others.





During PE, Year 5 have been honing their hockey skills with plenty of energy and enthusiasm! From mastering dribbling and passing to working in teams during mini games, the children have shown great progress. It has been wonderful to see their confidence grow, as well as their determination to perfect their skills, since the beginning of term.









English

In English, the class stepped into the world of Beowulf once again with a creative twist! Using freeze frames, they acted out dramatic scenes beginning from Grendel's mother smashing into Heorot, all the way to Beowulf diving into the water ready to fight the sea-hag. As you can see, the children captured the tension and bravery of the moment brilliantly—there were some fantastic expressions and poses that really brought the story to life. After this, they were then able to annotate their picture and used great vocabulary choices to explain how the character was feeling and why.

We have some baking planned too including Christmas chocolate bark, Bread, biscuit decorating and Gingerbread biscuits.


Children can also come to holiday club in their Christmas pyjamas or anything Christmas themed if they would like!
