What a fantastic first full week back it has been at St Peter's Bratton! The children have settled brilliantly into the new term, and there has been such a positive buzz around school.




Snow!

PE

We commenced swimming lessons this week and all children made the adults extremely proud. It was fantastic to see their enthusiasm, effort and support of each other. English

Our learning linked to Charlie and the Chocolate Factory is underway. Our learning has started by looking at the poem Chocolate Cake by Michael Rosen. We have performed the poem in groups and looked at how language is used to interest the reader and describe. Ask your child to tell you about the different features found within the poem.

Maths

We have just completed our unit on multiplication and division. We are now learning about length and perimeter.

Year 5



Science

This term, we are learning about living things and habitats. To hook year 5 into their learning, we played a game where the children had to figure out which animal was on their Post-it note. We used our knowledge of vertebrates and invertebrates to help us, as well as the other specific qualities that classify animals.

Our science has cross-curricular links with our geography this term, as we are learning about biomes. We have discussed the 6 main biomes and what makes them unique, and we are learning about the different flora and fauna found within that biome (ask your year 5 child what this means!).



English

In English, our focus this term is Shakespeare's 'The Tempest'. This week we have furthered our understanding of the characters by using freeze frames. We acted out scenes from 'The Tempest', thinking about how the characters would have been feeling in this moment, which will help us with our writing.
