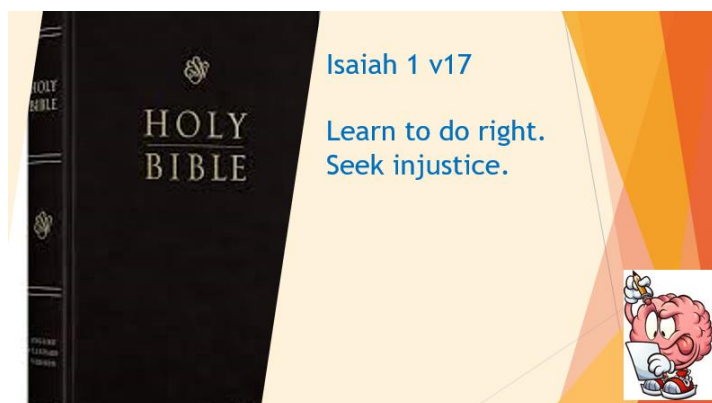


NEWSLETTER

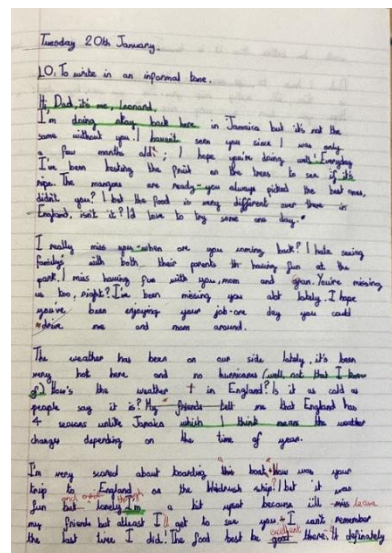
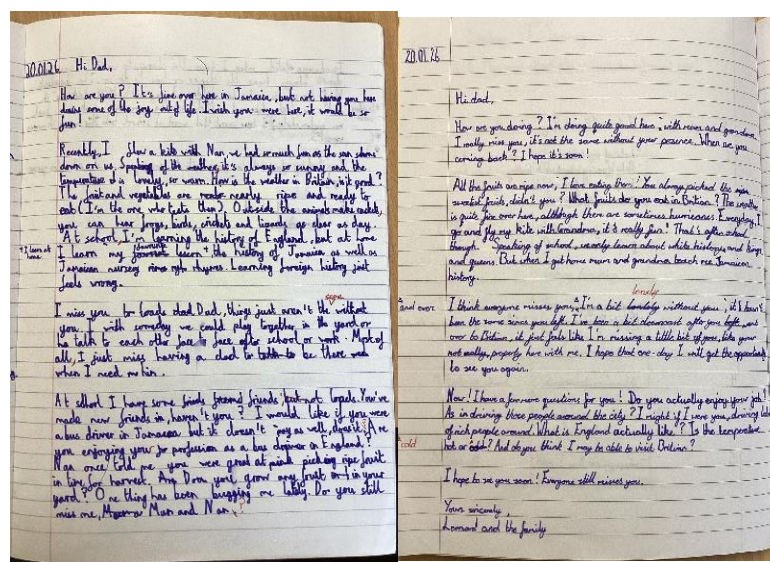
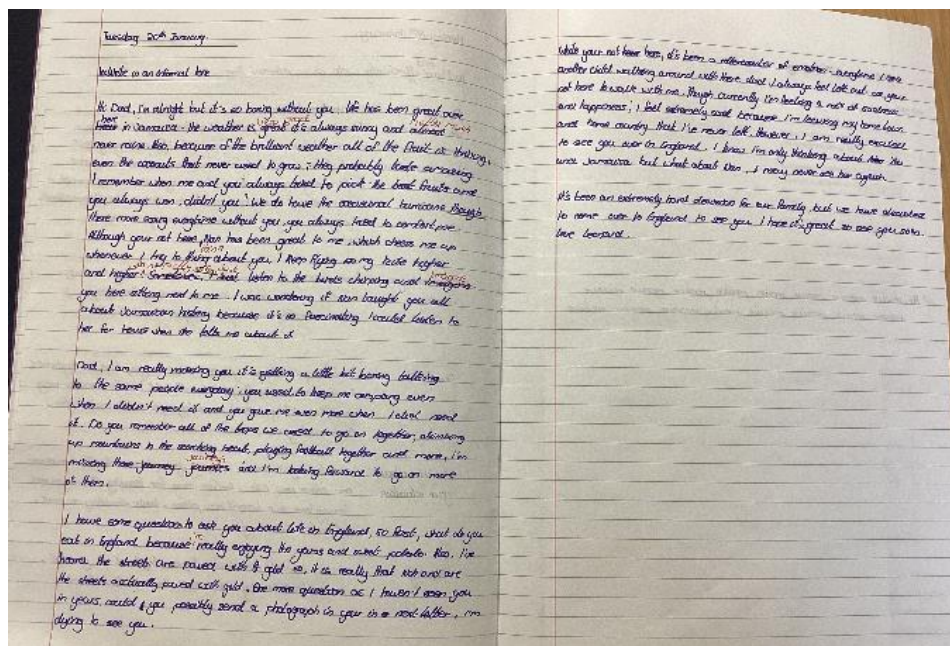
Year 6 Newsletter
