


# NEWSLETTER

## Our Christian Values

Paul reminds us that God often works in ways we don't expect, so slowing down and looking a little closer can help us see things more clearly. We encouraged the children to pause, ask questions, and stay open-minded—because sometimes, when we don't rush to judge, we discover something kinder, wiser, or more hopeful than we first imagined.

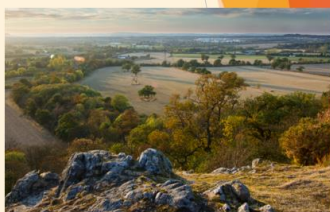

## Telford and Wrekin Pride Funding



We are delighted to share that, working in partnership with Councillor Kim Tonks, our school has been awarded £3,000 to enhance active play across St Peter's. This grant will allow us to install a range of playground markings on all four of our playgrounds, supplied by *Mark My Play* [Playground markings](#) | [School sports markings](#) | [Mark My Play](#). These markings will give pupils more opportunities to be active during break and lunchtime, encouraging games, movement, and imaginative play. They will also support important social skills such as turn-taking and cooperation. The new road track will help children learn about road safety in a fun, practical way, while our EYFS pupils will benefit from activities that develop their gross motor skills. With around 400 children using our outdoor spaces every day, this project will make a lasting difference for many years to come. We are extremely grateful to Councillor Tonks for gifting us this from her allocation.

We have continued our learning about the *seven continents*, building on the children's understanding of the world around them. This week, we focused on the continent of *Asia* and learnt that it is the largest continent in the world. We discovered that Asia is home to many *mega cities*, which are cities with very large populations and lots of tall buildings.



The children enjoyed exploring what makes a city a “mega city”, To develop this understanding further, the children worked together to *design and build their own mega cities using junk modelling materials*. They carefully selected materials, shared ideas, and talked about the features they wanted to include.

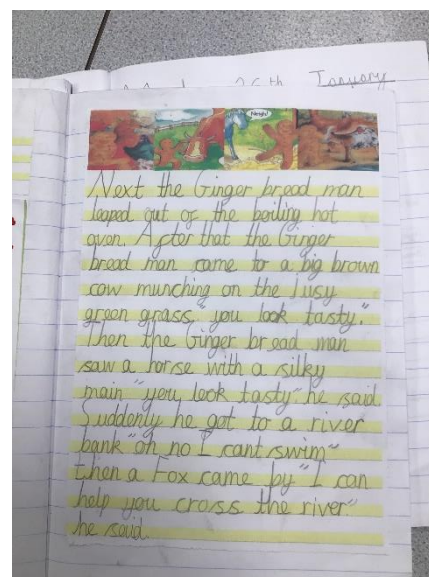
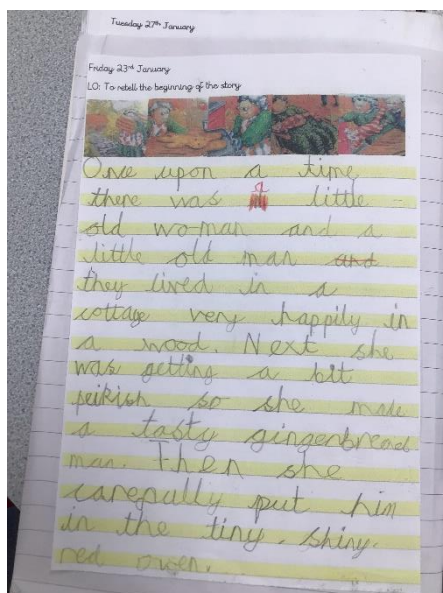
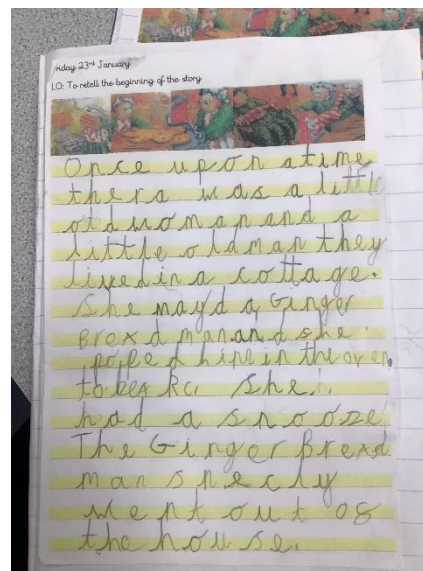
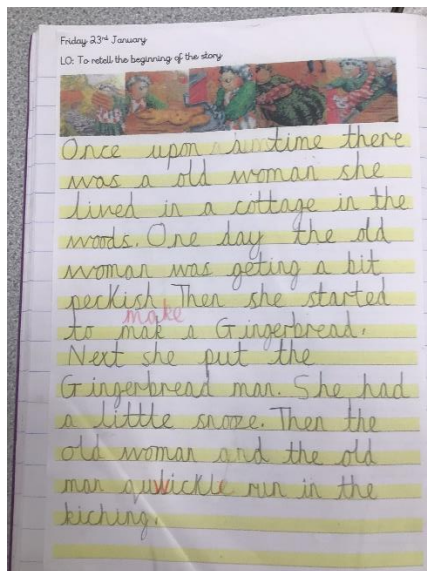




# YEAR TWO
