We speak calmly and listen to each other.




Solve Problems

Learning Conferences



Over the Christmas period Ashleigh & Samson organised and ran a small fundraising stall at their family salon, selling books, crafts, hot chocolates and samosas and in total they raised a huge £634.07 for Severn Hospice.

They have been invited to visit the hospice to see how their donation helps patients and families. They learned that their fundraising could support over 12 months of coffee mornings, provide 6 years' worth of craft materials for patients, and contribute towards the daily cost of care which is around £750 per day.

Over the last 2½ years, Ashleigh and Samson have now raised over £3,000 for charities of their choosing including St Peter's PTA, Alzheimer's Research and The Little Princess Trust. We are incredibly proud of their kindness, teamwork and community spirit.

They are already planning their next two events and have decided it will be for the British Heart Foundation and Air Ambulance.

In Science we have looked at the force of magnetism and begun to learn which materials are magnetic and which are not.








Science

We have carried out a test to prove that sound gets fainter as the distance from a sound source increases. Our results were then plotted on a line graph. We have also made an elastic band guitar to discuss vibration, testing different items and considering how each sound is made.

RE
