UPDATES AND INFORMATION

Photographs at school events:

As all the school Christmas events are fast approaching, I thought it would be helpful to share information ahead of time about photographs.

We do have children in school who cannot have their photograph taken, for various reasons. Rather than prohibit photographs at school events, we are going to continue with similar rules as last year.

Therefore, these are our rules around photographs and videos at school events:

- You can take photographs or videos of your own child only. Please zoom in on your child, excluding those surrounding them.

- The photographs and videos are not to be shared on any form of social media – including Facebook, Whatsapp, Twitter. If you need to send these to family or friends, please use email and attach the file.

If everyone follows these rules, we can continue to allow photography at school events. We may prohibit anyone who break the rules from future events or if a number of parents do so, stop photography all together – we do not want to do either of these.

Safeguarding Squad update.

This week we have been harvesting information on apps and games that children might be using at home. As a group, we discussed what each app allows the user to do, the risks to children and age restrictions. Over the next week we will be producing guides for parents about popular apps and how to help your child make smart tech choices at home. We learnt that Tik Tok, Instagram and Snap Chat all have age restrictions of 13+. WhatsApp has increased it's age restriction to 16 and YouTube accounts are for 18+ or 13+ if under the guidance of parents. Peer pressure is the main reason why children want to have these apps or unsuitable PEGI rating games. It is important to have open discussions with your children about what they are accessing and reminding them about safe and responsible use. Attached is a useful article for setting up new phones or other devices so that your child can use them safely, happily and responsibly.

Advent Trail

This year as part of our Advent preparations we are holding our first Advent Trail in school. After school on Wednesday 18th December we would like to welcome the whole school community to join us in celebrating the different parts of the Christmas story. In the hall there will be a number of stations and at each station there is information about a different part of the Christmas story and then an activity linked with that part of the story.
